Centennial Hall, Fair Park

Route Information: Use gate 2 or 3. See map on reverse side.

7:30-8:45 a.m. Student Check-In

Enter Centennial Hall through the East entrance – see map.

Pick up check-in packets upon arrival. Set up exhibits.

Students stay at project for Display & Safety inspection.

9:00 a.m.

All family, teachers, guests must exit the building.

Only students, judges and officials may remain.

9:30-10:30 a.m. Looking Toward College?

Presentation for parents at Science Place in Fair Park. See flyer.

9:00 a.m.-Noon Round One Judging - Interviews

All students should have at least three 10-minute interviews with judges.

Students are required to stay with their projects during this time.

Note: Interviews are an important part of the evaluation process.

Students not present for the interview are NOT eligible to win a 1st, 2nd, or 3rd in Science Category.

Noon (approximately)

All students exit the building.

Science Projects may not be removed, except for small valuable items.

Noon-1:00 p.m. Round Two Judging

All Science Category winners will be determined by the end of this Round.

1:00-2:00 p.m. First-in-Category Posted

All First-in-Category winners will be phoned on numbers they provided at

Check-In and asked to return to the building for Grand Prize judging. The

names of these winners will also be posted outside the East entrance to

the building. It is important that students are contactable during this time.

2:00-4:30 p.m. (approximately) Grand Prize Judging

To be considered for a Grand Prize, first-in-category winners must be

present for interview and remain during the Grand Prize Judging.

5:00-6.30 p.m. Free Public Exhibition

Science Fair open to the public. Grand Prize announcement will be made

around 6.00 p.m. Projects may not be removed – No Exceptions!

6.30-7.30 p.m. Project Tear-Down

For security reasons, whoever removes a project from the building

requires a Removal Pass. The pass will be provided in your check-in

packet on Saturday. Projects unclaimed after 7.30 p.m. will be stacked by

the entrance and disposed of Sunday by the cleaning contractor.

Notes

Supplies you may need:

- Covered tables and chairs will be provided. Students bring all other supplies needed for their exhibit, such as batteries, tape, scissors, staplers, etc. If 110V electric is required, students should bring a 25 ft., 16 gauge, grounded extension cord.

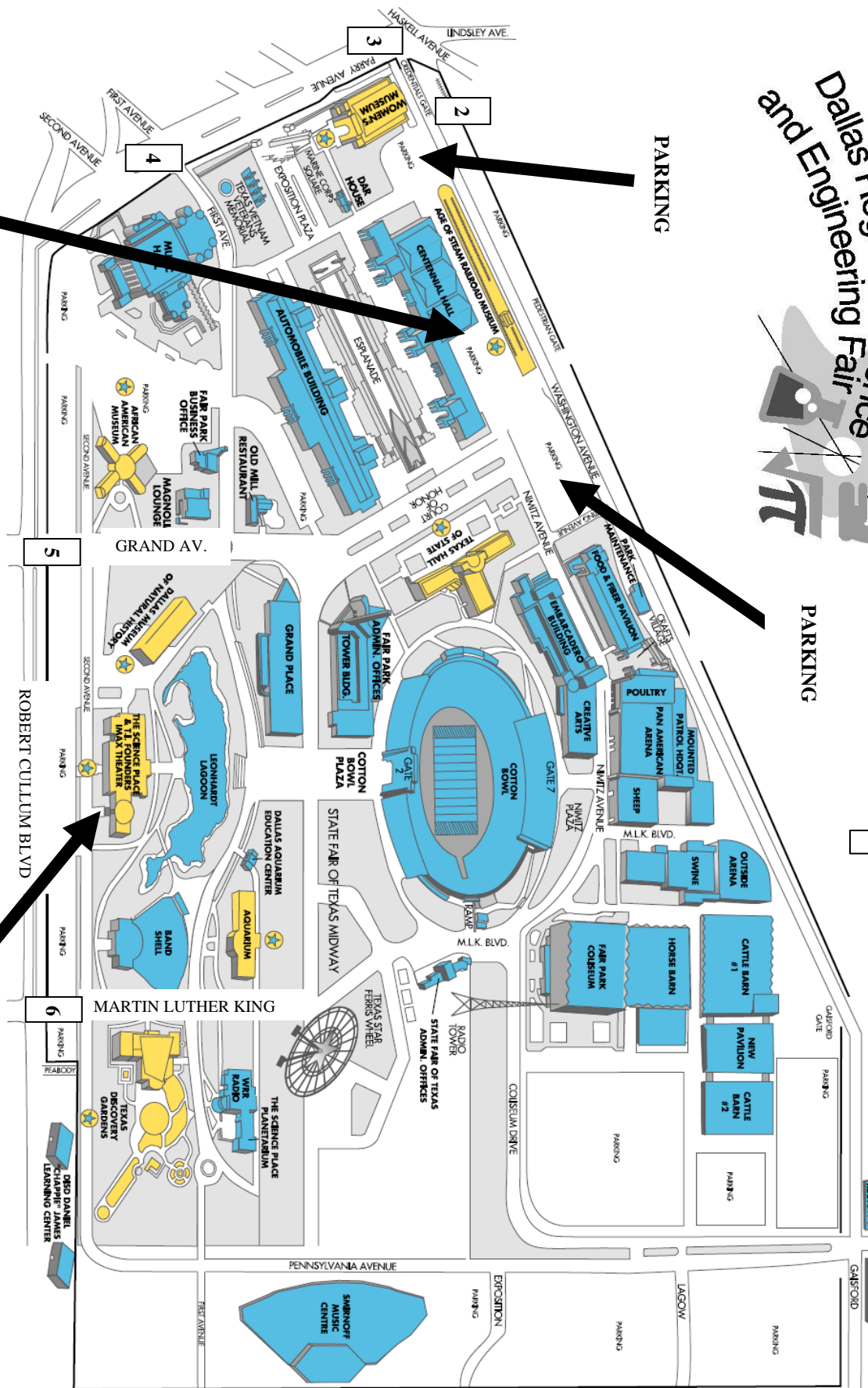
